John 14:8-12, 20

- 8 Philip saith unto him, Lord, shew us the Father, and it sufficeth us.
- 9 <u>Jesus saith unto him</u>, <u>Have I been so long time with you, and yet hast thou not known me, Philip?</u> <u>he that hath seen me hath seen the Father</u>; and how sayest thou then, Shew us the Father?
- 10 Believest thou not that I am in the Father, and the Father in me? the words that I speak unto you I speak not of myself: but the Father that dwelleth in me, he doeth the works.
- 11 <u>Believe me that I am in the Father, and the Father in me:</u> or else believe me for the very works' sake.
- 12 Verily, Verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father.
- 20 At that day ye shall know that I am in my Father, and ye in me, and I in you.

John 8:29

He that sent me is with me: the Father hath not left me alone; for I do always those things that please him.

Acts 10:38

How God (The Father) anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God (The Father) was with him.

MIRACLE AT POOL OF BETHSEDA

John 5:2-5, 8-9

- 2 Now there is at Jerusalem by the sheep market <u>a pool</u>, which is called in the Hebrew tongue <u>Bethesda</u>, having five porches.
- 3 In these lay a great multitude of impotent folk, of blind, halt, withered, waiting for the moving of the water.
- 4 For an angel went down at a certain season into the pool, and troubled the water: whosoever then first after the troubling of the water stepped in was made whole of whatsoever disease he had.
- 5 And a certain man was there, which had an infirmity thirty and eight years.
- 8 Jesus saith unto him, Rise, take up thy bed, and walk.
- 9 And immediately the man was made whole, and took up his bed, and walked: and on the same day was the sabbath.

MIRACLE AT POOL OF BETHSEDA CONTINUED ...

John 5:15-19, 30

- 15 The man departed, and told the Jews that it was Jesus, which had made him whole.
- 16 And therefore did the Jews persecute Jesus, and sought to slay him, because he had done these things on the sabbath day.
- 17 But Jesus answered them, My Father worketh hitherto, and I work.
- 18 <u>Therefore the Jews sought the more to kill him</u>, because he not only had broken the sabbath, but said also that God was his Father, making himself equal with God.
- 19 Then answered Jesus and said unto them, Verily, Verily, I say unto you, The Son can do nothing of himself, but what he seeth the Father do: for what things soever he doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise.
- 30 <u>I can of mine own self do nothing:</u> as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because I seek not mine own will, but the will of the Father which hath sent me.

BLIND MAN IN THE TEMPLE - WORKS OF THE FATHER

John 9:1-4

- 1 And as Jesus passed by, he saw a man which was blind from his birth.
- 2 And his disciples asked him, saying, Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind?
- 3 Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God (The Father) should be made manifest in him.
- 4 <u>I must work the works of him that sent me</u>, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work.

John 10:19-21, 24-25, 30-32,36-38

- 19 There was a division therefore again among the Jews for these sayings.
- 20 And many of them said, He hath a devil, and is mad; why hear ye him?
- 21 Others said, These are not the words of him that hath a devil. Can a devil open the eyes of the blind?
- 24 Then came the Jews round about him, and said unto him, <u>How long dost thou make us to doubt? If</u> thou be the Christ, tell us plainly.
- 25 Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me.
- 30 I and my Father are one.
- 31 Then the Jews took up stones again to stone him.
- 32 Jesus answered them, <u>Many good works have I shewed you from my Father</u>; for which of those works do ye stone me?
- 36 Say ye of him, whom the Father hath sanctified, and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest; because I said, I am the Son of God?
- 37 If I do not the works of my Father, believe me not.
- 38 But if I do, though ye believe not me, believe the works: that ye may know, and believe, that the Father is in me, and I in him.

RAISING OF LAZARUS FROM THE DEAD

John 11:1, 4, 39-45

- 1 Now a certain man was sick, named Lazarus, of Bethany, the town of Mary and her sister Martha.
- 4 When Jesus heard that, he said, This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby.
- 23 Jesus saith unto her, Thy brother shall rise again.
- 24 Martha saith unto him, I know that he shall rise again in the resurrection at the last day.
- 25 Jesus said unto her, <u>I am the resurrection, and the life</u>: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live:
- 39 Jesus said, Take ye away the stone. <u>Martha, the sister of him that was dead, saith unto him, Lord, by this time he stinketh: for he hath been dead four days.</u>
- 40 Jesus saith unto her, Said I not unto thee, that, if thou wouldest believe, thou shouldest see the glory of God? (The Glory of the Father)
- 41 Then they took away the stone from the place where the dead was laid. And Jesus lifted up his eyes, and said, <u>Father</u>, I thank thee that thou hast heard me.
- 42 And I knew that thou hearest me always: but because of the people which stand by I said it, that they may believe that thou hast sent me.
- 43 And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, Lazarus, come forth.
- 44 And he that was dead came forth, bound hand and foot with grave clothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, Loose him, and let him go.
- 45 Then many of the Jews which came to Mary, had seen the things which Jesus did, believed on him.
- 53 Then from that day forth they took counsel together for to put him to death.

John 12:1-2, 9-13, 17-19

- 1 Then Jesus six days before the passover came to Bethany, where Lazarus was which had been dead, whom he raised from the dead.
- 2 There they made him a supper; and Martha served: but <u>Lazarus was one of them that sat at the table with him.</u>
- 9 Much people of the Jews therefore knew that he was there: and they came not for Jesus' sake only, but that they might see Lazarus also, whom he had raised from the dead.
- 10 But the chief priests consulted that they might put Lazarus also to death;
- 11 Because that by reason of him many of the Jews went away, and believed on Jesus.
- 12 On the next day much people that were come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem,
- 13 Took branches of palm trees, and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord.
- 17 The people therefore that was with him when he called Lazarus out of his grave, and raised him from the dead, bare record. (continued to spread the word and testify about)
- 18 For this cause the people also met him, for that they heard that he had done this miracle.
- 19 The Pharisees therefore said among themselves, Perceive ye how ye prevail nothing? behold, the world is gone after him.

John 12:23-33

- 23 And Jesus answered them, saying, The hour is come, that the Son of man should be glorified.
- 24 Verily, Verily, I say unto you, <u>Except a corn of wheat fall into the ground and die</u>, <u>it abideth alone:</u> <u>but if it die, it bringeth forth much fruit.</u>
- 25 He that loveth his life shall lose it; and he that hateth his life in this world shall keep it unto life eternal.
- 26 <u>If any man serve me</u>, <u>let him follow me</u>; <u>and where I am, there shall also my servant be</u>: if any man serve me, him will my Father honour.
- 27 <u>Now is my soul troubled;</u> and what shall I say? Father, save me from this hour: but for this cause came I unto this hour.
- 28 <u>Father, glorify thy name.</u> <u>Then came there a voice from heaven, saying, I have both glorified it, and will glorify it again.</u>
- 29 The people therefore, that stood by, and heard it, said that it thundered: others said, An angel spake to him.
- 30 Jesus answered and said, This voice came not because of me, but for your sakes.
- 31 Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out.
- 32 And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me.
- 33 This he said, signifying what death he should die.

John 12:42-45

- 42 Nevertheless <u>among the chief rulers also many believed on him</u>; but because of the Pharisees they did not confess him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue:
- 43 For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God.
- 44 Jesus cried and said, He that believeth on me, believeth not on me, but on him that sent me.
- 45 And he that seeth me seeth him that sent me.

John 14:12
